A 30-amp system provides 3,600 watts of power (120 volts x 30 amps), which is generally sufficient for RVs with a single air conditioner, essential appliances, and typical electrical needs. Approximately 80% of RVs use 30-amp electrical systems.

What type of electrical connection should I use for my RV?

The type of connection you use will depend on your RV electrical hookup. If you have a campsite with only a 30-amp connection and a 50-amp RV electrical plug on your RV electrical cord, RV electrical adapters will allow you to power the RV from the 30-amp supply.
