Where was the ancient battery found in Baghdad?

This historical artifact is a collection of three objects found in Khujut Rabuin the southeast of Baghdad near the ruins of Ctesiphon metropolis, the Parthian, and later Sassanid, Capital. The ancient battery was lost during the looting frenzies caused by the 2003 invasion of Iraq.

What happened to the Baghdad Battery?

Despite extensive searches for the artifact, it has never been found.
